2.	<b>Declarations of Interest :</b> Cllrs Gardiner and McCormick for item 6.6.1.	
3.	<b>Minutes of Annual General Meeting held on 17<sup>th</sup> May</b> having been previously circulated were accepted on the proposition of Cllr Potter.	
4.	<b>Minutes of the Meeting held on 17<sup>th</sup> May</b> having been previously circulated were accepted on the proposition of Cllr McCormick.	
	At this stage the Chairman closed the main meeting of the Council to allow for open discussion with representatives from CEMEX and Planning Officer concerning the S106.	
5.	<p><b>Haslingfield Road Development</b></p> <p><u>5.1 Section 106</u> discussion notes appendix a.</p> <p><u>5.2 Water Report situation:</u> Chairman, Clerk and Messrs Goding and Stapleton had met with CEMEX and their consultants on 25<sup>th</sup> May. It was agreed that further work needed to be undertaken on water management issues. Clerk reported that the Flood Report from incident in July 2015 was due to be published end of June.</p> <p><u>5.3 Network Rail Consultation :</u> Network Rail is developing proposals for possible closure or change to public rights of way at over 130 of its level crossings in Anglia region. Barrington Road is one of the crossings where the proposal is to close the level crossing to all users. It is located in Foxton parish and is a pedestrian and equestrian crossing with locking gates. Proposals are to either cross railway at the immediately adjacent Foxton level crossing; or if they wish to go to Barrington Road users would have to divert along the A10 where a new pedestrian refuge will be provided as well as new footway along part of Barrington Road. Consultation period ends 1<sup>st</sup> July. Clerk to arrange to publicise on website and “Spotted”. Cllr Day and District Cllr Van de Weyer had attended the consultation event and it was apparent that Network Rail were not aware of CEMEX proposal for the footpath/cycleway to the station. Council are aware that a lot of young people walk to the station and agreed the proposals are totally unacceptable. District Cllr Van de Weyer stated that it was also unsafe for cycling and the current pedestrian crossing is part of the cycle route.</p>	VT

	<p>There is to be a second Public consultation in August/September when Network Rail will present the preferred option. When asked if Network Rail could do this, County Cllr Kindersley said they can propose but would have to go through Highways Department. Cllr Day has notified P. Gaskin the footpaths officer. All Cllrs to respond either by post or on line. Clerk to formulate Council response.</p> <p><u>5.4 Railway update/Liaison Group Meeting</u> : Liaison Group meeting date still to be agreed. I Southcott to arrange with Susan Walford from S.C.D.C. When asked why railway line couldn't be used for the cycleway, CEMEX confirmed that the line is protected and has to stay.</p> <p><u>5.5 Traffic data report</u> has been received and all Councillors have received a copy. Cllr Rhodes-Kemp reported that the working party aimed to meet on 22<sup>nd</sup> July and would include Messrs Tydeman and Johns. <p>6.</p>	<p><b>South Cambs District Council</b></p> <p><u>6.1 Devolution</u> : District Cllr Van de Weyer reported on the proposal to form a Combined authority for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough which is being submitted to Government. The proposal had been circulated, is available on the website and the bid includes (a) a single person in charge, usually referred to as a mayor (b) an annual fund for next 30 years of £70million to support economic growth, local infrastructure and jobs (c) £170million for affordable housing - will be looking for exception sites (d) transport improvements to A14/142, upgrades to A10 and A47 (e) rail improvements etc. He reported that most of the £100m on housing would be in South Cambs and Cambridge city. All councils involved were to meet in October.</p> <p><u>6.2 City Deal</u> : D. Cllr Van de Weyer reported that Group were considering use of the inner ring road especially during rush hour instead of congestion charging.</p> <p><u>6.3</u> S.C.D.C. are compiling a register of <u>brownfield sites</u> – of any size.</p> <p><u>6.4 S.C.D.C.
